

Life's Purpose

Within the **game of life**, the various lesser games and purposes occlude the basic purpose we chose in the first place. Fortunately, "Experiencing Self" lifts a person above the mundane games they got involved in as a "person" and allows them to recover the purpose they originally created when first deciding to play the game of life. Do not forget that nothing happens without a prior decision, so we must each have decided what purpose we chose to pursue.

"Experiencing Self" is very personal, for it concerns the real you. Likewise, your basic purpose in "The game of life" is very personal, because it is of your own choosing. The "Life's Purpose" exercise recovers your purpose in life as a Being. **It transcends time.**
